Introduction

Primary agricultural societies are part of the backbone of rural communities across the province. These societies play an important role in the communities they serve by bringing community members together to improve the quality of life for rural Albertans.

The Alberta government offers grant funding to support primary agricultural societies and the activities they undertake to enhance and enrich the rural communities they serve.

These guidelines and the sample grant application include instructions to assist applicants in completing their grant application. If require additional information, please contact the program office.

Primary Agricultural Societies Grant Program

The Primary Agricultural Societies Grant Program provides primary agricultural societies with grant funding for activities that align with Agriculture and Irrigation's (AGI) priorities and support outcomes identified in the ministry's business plan:

Outcome 1: Alberta's economy grows through investment in the agricultural sector.

Outcome 2: Agricultural productivity and resilience and rural quality of life are strengthened, diversified and enhanced.

Eligible societies receive a base grant of \$17,500. In addition, societies can claim eligible expenses from the previous operating year to receive partial reimbursement.

The application deadline for the 2026 Primary Agricultural Societies Operating Grant Program is February 15, 2026.

Eligibility requirements

Primary agricultural societies that wish to receive grant funding must complete a grant application and submit it to AGI. Ministry staff will review each society's application to determine eligibility for grant funding.

Primary agricultural societies must be in good standing under the Agricultural Societies Act and operate a facility or run an agricultural event or program to be eligible to receive grant funding.

Reporting expenses

Claims that fall under the following categories are eligible for partial reimbursement:

- Governance, Leadership and Training Expenses
- Agricultural Activities and Programs Expenses
- Operational Expenses.

Societies must use the grant application to report eligible expenses from the previous operating year. Additional supporting documentation is also required.

- Include year-end financial statements to demonstrate the expenses are paid in full, such as an audit report/review engagement report prepared by a professional accounting firm.
- Include supporting schedules and copies of ledgers or complete a statement of expense template to support your claim. For additional information about this template see Appendix E.

Provide adequate information about the expenses you claim.

- Describe expenses/activities in detail by including the full name of camps, conferences, courses, and agricultural activities.
- Use the statement of expense template to provide a full breakdown (description of all expenses) for events that exceed \$1,000.
- Do not use acronyms. For example: “EFPC” will not be accepted – write out the full name “Environmental Farm Planning Course.”
- Do not use the term “donation” to describe an expense.

Expenses that have already been paid or reimbursed by another organization are not eligible for reimbursement. Societies must deduct these expenses from their operating expenses. Examples include:

- expenses that have already been paid using grant funding provided by the Alberta Association of Agricultural Societies (AAAS) to support Open Farm Days activities.
- expenses that have already been paid using funding from municipal operating grants.

Additional information about expenses:

- Travel within Canada is eligible for reimbursement.
 - Mileage and lodging claims are reimbursed at Government of Alberta rates (see Appendix F).
- Ineligible expenses include:
 - GST and taxes.
 - bank/interest fees, lease payments and late payment penalties.
 - in-kind and in-contra expenses, including the donated use of facilities.

Appendixes A-G on the following pages provide additional information to help primary agricultural societies complete the grant application form – including examples of eligible and ineligible expenses.

Appendix A: Governance, Leadership, and Training Expenses (Section 1)

This funding category supports agricultural societies by reimbursing:

- expenses incurred to enhance governance and leadership capacity within a society to support its operations and objectives.
 - Expenses related to regular meetings are not eligible (e.g. annual general meetings, regular board/committee meetings).

Examples of eligible expenses:

Governance	Leadership	Training
Alberta Association of Agricultural Societies conference & regional meetings	Registration for youth leadership activities (programs, camps, etc.)	Facility operations training for staff and volunteers (e.g. food safety, pro-serve, first aid, ice maintenance)
Board development activities (e.g. financial planning workshops, governance training)	Post-secondary scholarships	Conference fees for staff & volunteers related to agricultural society activities
	Sponsoring community leadership activities (4-H public speaking programs)	

Appendix B: Agricultural Activities and Program Expenses (Section 2)

This funding category supports agricultural societies by reimbursing:

- expenses incurred for activities, events, and programs specifically connected to “agricultural events.”
 - To be eligible for reimbursement, events/and programming must demonstrate strong agricultural relevance.
 - Expenses related to non-agricultural programming are not eligible.
 - Examples are provided below.

Examples of eligible expenses:

Examples of ineligible expenses:

Pro-rodeos	Non-agricultural activities and contests (ATV rally, BMX, sport-dog shows)	Donations to non-agricultural activities
Alcohol & corkage fees/beer gardens	Chuck wagons/pony chucks	Running of the bulls
Entertainment (e.g. music, parades, petting zoos, pony rides etc.)	Food/concession supplies	Purchase of capital items (e.g. gravel, sand, chutes, etc.)
Fundraising activities (bingos, casinos, raffles, etc.)	Facility operations (ice-plant start-up)	Licensing fees

Appendix C: Operational Expenses (Section 3)

This funding category supports agricultural societies by reimbursing:

- Some major expenses related to facility operations.
 - Expenses for new construction or major renovations are not eligible.
- Eligible expenses identified on financial statements (for example, bookkeeping fees, insurance, utilities, repairs and maintenance and wages).
 - Claim bookkeeping expenses separately from professional fees (provide supporting documentation, such as a ledger).

Examples of eligible expenses:

Insurance	Wages/salaries & workers' compensation board premiums (include bookkeeping expenses)	Utilities (heat/power)
Repairs and Maintenance (Max \$10,000) e.g. floor stripping, janitor supplies, equipment rentals, etc.		

Examples of ineligible expenses:

Professional Fees (accounting, legal fees)

Appendix D: Base Grant (Section 4)

Base grant funding is provided to reimburse expenditures that “encourage improvement in agriculture and enhance quality of life for people living in the community” as defined in the *Agricultural Societies Act*.

- Agricultural societies may spend grant funding to develop educational programs, events, services, and facilities based on community needs.
- The agricultural society’s total operational spending must exceed the base grant each year.

Appendix F: Travel Related Expenses

The Travel Expenses Schedule is based on the Alberta government's Meal and Hospitality Expense Policy.

- All travel-related expenses must be reasonable and appropriate.
- Expenses will be approved at the sole discretion of the Minister.
- GST is ineligible.
- Receipts may be requested.

Travel by Air

- Economy airfare is eligible.
- Cancellation insurance is not eligible.

Travel by Ground

- Taxi, intra-city public transportation is eligible.
- Parking is eligible.
- Vehicle rental (compact rate only).
 - Eligible only if there is a valid business purpose for renting a vehicle.
- The business kilometer rate for a private vehicle is \$0.57 per km.
 - Proof of travel is required.

Accommodation

- Claim the reasonable actual cost of accommodation (receipt required) or the accommodation allowance of \$20.15 per night.
