



Advanced Wildland Fire Behaviour – CFFC National Course

Overview/Description

An understanding of fire behaviour provides the basis for all fire management and fire suppression decision making. This course addresses the principles of fire behaviour at an advanced level. Systems and guides such as the Canadian Forest Fire Danger Rating System are explained and practised through exercises and documented fire case studies.

Target Audience

Operations Section Chiefs/Incident Command Team Members, Forest Managers, Fire Specialists, Suppression Personnel and Wildfire Crew Member instructors. Applicable employees, contract and seasonal staff, registered instructors, forest industry personnel, national wildfire agencies, structural fire agencies.

Prerequisites

Successful completion of fire behaviour at the intermediate level and have a solid basic understanding of the FWI System and Red Book with last 3 years.

Registration

Forestry Division employees register through your local training contact.

Individuals outside of Forestry Division, please contact your local or provincial training contact.

Non-wildfire agency staff need sponsorship or referral from a wildfire agency and would register through the appropriate provincial training contact.
