Background

Clint Docken completed both his Bachelor of Science in Geography and his Bachelor of Laws degree at the University of Saskatchewan in 1974.

Following his graduation from law school, he relocated to Calgary to complete his articles and practice law, establishing his own firm in 1978.

Clint managed his own firm until 2016. Currently he is counsel with Napoli Shkolnik Canada in Calgary.

Experience

Clint has extensive civil litigation experience and has provided legal counsel in many precedent-setting cases in the Alberta Court of Queen's Bench, the Court of Appeal and the Supreme Court of Canada.

Since 1989 Clint has had considerable experience in the field of mediation, both representing parties and as a mediator. He has participated in over 200 mediation conferences, the majority of these as mediator in relation to varied issues including: personal injury litigation; insurance litigation; commercial litigation; wills and estates; community municipal law disputes; oil and gas disputes; labour and employment disputes; and professional liability issues.

He has also been on the ADR Roster of the Energy Resources Conservation Board/Alberta Energy Regulator for many years. He was involved in year-long ADR processes leading to the resolution of both the National Hepatitis C and Indian Residential School issues.

Additionally, Clint was previously on the Roster of the Farm Debt Review Board, and mediated a number of Farm Debt matters throughout the years.

He was appointed a Chartered Mediator by the Arbitration and Mediation Institute of Canada, Inc. in 1999, the highest distinction recognized in the field.

He has taught multi-party mediation at Mount Royal University since 1990.

Clint is currently on the roster of ADR Chambers, a National ADR agency - a roster that includes a number of former Supreme Court of Canada and Trial Division Judges. He is also approved as mediator for the department of Municipal Affairs.

Mr. Docken also has extensive experience in the field of administrative law. He has appeared in front of many administrative agencies, including the Environmental Appeal Board on multiple occasions in relation to the Water Act, the former Energy Resources Conservation Board (now the Alberta Energy Regulator) the Natural Resources Conservation Board, the Fatality Review Board, the Criminal Injuries Review Board, and the Municipal Government Board, and the Rocky View Subdivision and Development Appeal Board and it's predecessors.

Clint has significant experience in public policy initiatives. He was involved in the development of Alberta Class Action legislation, and has participated in the following public advisory processes:
